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What is a Federal Grant??

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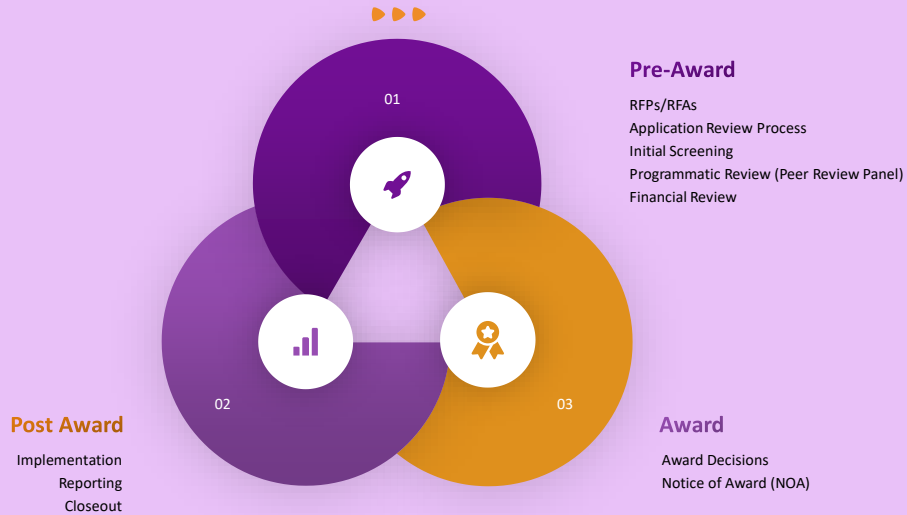
A grant is a way the government funds your ideas and projects to provide public services and stimulate the economy. Grants support critical recovery initiatives, innovative research, and many other programs listed in the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA).

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Federal Funding Lifecycle

Pre-Award

- RFPs/RFAs/NOFAs

Application Review Process

- Initial screening to ensure application is complete;
- Programmatic review and assessment of the substance of the applications;
- Financial review of proposed budgets and
- Award decision and announcement.

Award Decisions

- 90-120 days after submission and review;

Notice of Award (NOA)

- Received after review process and clearances have been met.

Post Award

Implementation

- Implementing the grant, reporting process and closeout activities.



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Federal Funding Lifecycle (cont'd)

Reporting

- Monitor and Controlling approach;
 - Different types of approaches
- Semi-annual, both programmatic as well as fiscal reporting;
- Performance Measures

Closeout Activities

- Closeout Processes
 - Fiscal/Administrative
 - Lessons Learned Repository
 - Transition

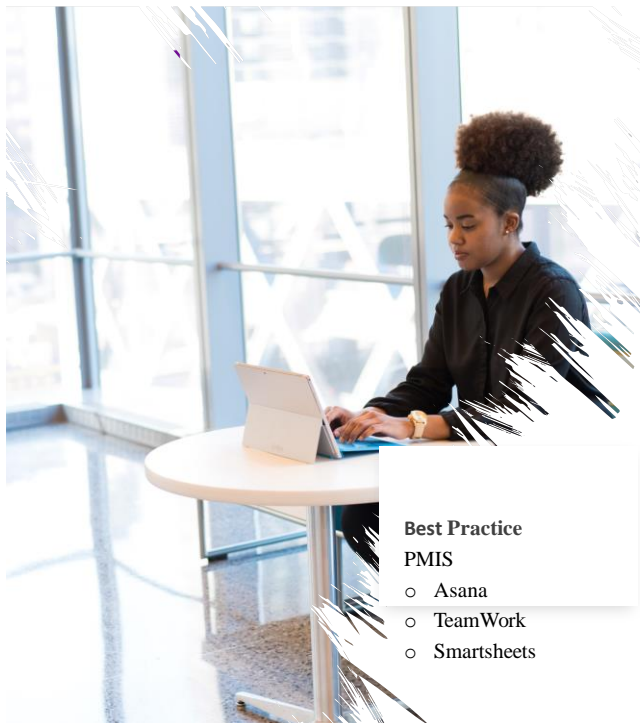
